

SAFEGUARDING POLICY

"The Church loves all her children like a loving mother, but cares for all and protects with a special affection those who are smallest and defenceless. This is the duty that Christ himself entrusted to the entire Christian community."

(Apostolic Letter issued 'motu proprio' by the Supreme Pontiff Francis, 4 June 2016)

Purpose

To promote a culture of safeguarding within the Archdiocese and reduce the risks of abuse and harm.

Scope

This policy applies to all parishes, ministries, and agencies under the jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Brisbane and to Associations of Christ's Faithful or Public Juridic Persons which freely opt in to its application and which enter into an agreement with the Archdiocese accordingly. The policy applies to all Archdiocesan workers (including clergy, religious, employees and volunteers).

Policy

National Catholic Safeguarding Standards

The Archdiocese adopts and adheres to the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards. The Standards apply to all parishes, ministries, and agencies under the jurisdiction of the Archbishop.

Safeguarding Commitment

The Archdiocese has zero tolerance for all forms of abuse and is committed to safeguarding everyone involved in its activities, ministries, and services. The safety and wellbeing of children and adults-at-risk is paramount.

Safeguarding Principles

- Safeguarding is a shared responsibility.
- Treat everyone with dignity and respect.
- Prioritise the protection and best interests of children and adults-at-risk.
- Provide safe physical and online environments.
- Actively identify and manage safeguarding and abuse risks.
- Monitor compliance with safeguarding standards, policies, and procedures.
- Respond promptly and effectively to abuse concerns, suspicions, disclosures, complaints, reports, and incidents.
- Comply with all legal obligations to report suspected abuse and harm.

Compliance

Non-compliance with this policy which seriously jeopardises the safety and wellbeing of others may be grounds for disciplinary action up to dismissal or termination of employment, and reporting to authorities.

SAFE CONDUCT STANDARDS Respect & Protect

The Archdiocese has zero tolerance for all forms of abuse and is committed to safeguarding everyone involved in its activities, ministries and services.

The safety and wellbeing of children, young people and adults-at-risk is paramount.

These Standards establish the behaviours expected of all Archdiocesan workers (including clergy, religious, paid employees and volunteers) when interacting with children, young people and adults-at-risk. They apply to all Archdiocesan parishes, ministries, services and agencies and should be read in conjunction with other Archdiocesan and church codes of conduct and behaviour standards.

Children/Child/Young People/Young Person: any person under 18 years of age.

Adult-at-Risk: any person over 18 years of age whose capacity to protect themselves is significantly diminished by an impairment or circumstances (permanent or temporary) and they are at increased risk of abuse.


Behaviour Standards

DO:

- Promote the best interests and human rights of children, young people and adults-at-risk.
- Treat all children, young people and adults-at-risk with dignity and respect.
- Respect the diverse backgrounds, characteristics and beliefs of children, young people and adults-at-risk.
- Create environments that are inclusive and culturally safe for all children, young people and adults-at-risk.
- Listen and respond to the views and concerns of children, young people and adults-at-risk.
- Maintain proper physical and personal boundaries with children, young people and adults-at-risk.
- Respect and protect the privacy of children, young people and adults-at-risk.
- Actively manage risks to the safety and well-being of children, young people and adults-at-risk.
- Promptly report all abuse concerns, suspicions, disclosures, reports, complaints and incidents.
- Take prompt action to ensure the safety of a child, young person or adults who may be at risk of abuse.

DO <u>NOT</u>:

- (\mathbf{x}) Have unnecessary or unauthorised physical contact with a child, young person or adult-at-risk.
- Have unnecessary or unauthorised one-on-one contact with a child, young person or adult-at-risk (including online). $\mathbf{\mathbb{C}}$
- \mathbf{C} Be excessively familiar or foster a 'special relationship' with a child, young person or adult-at-risk.
- (\mathbf{X}) Use abusive, obscene or sexual language towards or in the presence a child, young person or adult-at-risk.
- (\mathbf{X}) Show a child, young person or adult-at-risk sexual or pornographic images.
- Interact with children, young people and adults-at-risk while under the influence of liquor or drugs. (\mathbf{C})
- Unlawfully supply a child or young person with liquor or drugs. (\mathbf{X})
- Unlawfully disclose personal or sensitive information about a child, young person or adult-at-risk. (\mathbf{C})
- Take or share images of a child, young person or adult-at-risk without full and proper consent. $\mathbf{\mathbb{C}}$
- Unlawfully discriminate against a child, young person or adult-at-risk. (\mathbf{X})




